Hyperlipidemias

Hyperlipidemias are a group of rare diseases whose symptoms include increased blood lipid or lipoprotein concentrations. These diseases are rare and do not cause acute symptoms, meaning they often remain undiagnosed.

Hyperlipidemias are a risk factor for cardiovascular diseases because they increase cholesterol deposition on vascular walls. This causes the development of cardiovascular diseases at a young age and can often lead to death.

Hyperlipidemia treatment does not fully cure disease but slows its progression, so an accurate diagnosis and appropriate treatment must be performed as early as possible.

The symptoms, diagnosis and management of hyperlipidemias will be discussed during the conference.
